



## Col. David H. Stohler, Ret.

June 2, 1934 - February 10, 2016

Col. David H. Stohler Ret., 81, died Weds. Feb 10. 2016 at Lutheran Hospital, Ft Wayne. David was born on the Stohler farm in Anderson, Indiana on June 2, 1934. He graduated from Markleville High School in 1952 . He married his wife Judith (Smith) on October 13, 1961.

David retired as the Vice Wing Commander of the 122nd TFW, Ft Wayne, in 1989 after 34 years of service. During his time in service he logged over 3,600 hours of flight time in fighter jets and was deployed to Europe for the Berlin Crisis, he served 2 tours from a NATO base in Tripoli and worked with a pilot exchange program with Turkey and the West German Air Force.

David passed on his military legacy to his son Col Michael Stohler, his daughter Michele Mechling, grandson Shane Quillen, granddaughter Ashley Canfield, grandson Kaleb Mechling and nephew Robert Gustin.

He is survived by his wife Judith, his children: daughters - Lisa Bernarducci & Michele (Kevin)Mechling and son Michael Stohler (Michelle). He has 8 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren. 2 sisters Grace (Harold) Markle and Faith (Jim) Burmeister.

He is preceded in death by his parents Audrey and Henry Stohler, Step Father Roy Gooding, sisters Dellarose Gustin and Paula Nugent and brother Phillip.

Funeral Services will be held at 5 p.m. on Sunday (February 14, 2016) at the First Church of Christ in Bluffton. Pastor Larry Sprinkle and Chaplain Michael Frese of the 122nd Fighter Wing will officiate. Calling hours will be held from 2 to 8 on Saturday at the Thoma/Rich, Lemler Funeral Home and for one hour prior to the service on Sunday at the church. Burial will take place at a later time at Elm Grove Cemetery. Memorials may be made to the First Church of Christ or to Mt Zion Lutheran Church in Anderson. “Dad, what a wonderful father and mentor you have been to me. At an early age I wanted to be just like you- a Farmer and Fighter Pilot. Growing up on the small farm you taught me so much. You could fix absolutely anything. I recall one day working on the cultivator, I must have only been 8 or 9. You couldn't get one of the rollers separated from the machine after using the wrench, then the torch. You grumble with your teeth gritting and said “Oh well, ----, Michael, go get the 16 pound sledge hammer!” So I ran to the barn and came back “dragging” it because it was so heavy. I was ready to watch in awe as you beat the heck out of that part. However, you briefed me on a different plan—I was to hold the big steel punch pin on top of the cultivator over the part and you would take a full swing at the pin in my hands. Now I wasn't too experienced at the time but I was pretty sure if you missed the pin I was going to have a broken hand at best. I must have been shaking holding that pin; cause you said several times to hold still or you might miss. That helped a bunch dad. Ha. What trust we both had for each other. I was trusting that you wouldn't miss. You were trusting I wouldn't move----cause mom would kill ya if you broke my hand. So with my eyes closed and holding that pin steady, I heard the swish of air as the sledge hammer moved in a full circle over your head then----- wham it hit the pin and out popped the part. I couldn't believe it. You really know your stuff. And I still had my hands!

Oh Dad, you gave me all the tools to be a good fighter pilot. I had a Honda dirt bike, a dog and a gun. You let me plow the field when I was only 9 all by myself. And let me get real “rowdy” with all my friends when I was a teen ager. All along maybe you knew that is what makes a good fighter pilot—pushing the boundaries and making mistakes was the best way to learn. I remember so much of my childhood, flying with you, working with you, farming.

I will miss that special bond you and I had as Fighter pilots. I could tell you personal things about flying and you knew exactly what I was saying—like night air refueling in bad weather, or flying on the wing at 20,000 feet in the weather at night. We would share stories over and over again.

I will miss those conversations on your porch about my combat flying that only you -- a dad and fighter pilot would understand. What great therapy that was just sipping on a beer and telling flying stories. Every time I fly, I will think of you. Every cloud I zip thru, every sunrise or sunset I see from 30,000 feet I know you will be there.


