Betty Lou Petzel, 88, of Spring Hills, Florida a former Bluffton Resident passed away on Thursday evening, September 5, 2013, at the Sturgill Hospice Care Center.

Mrs. Petzel was born on February 23, 1925 in Bluffton to Dale D. & Marie (Schlagenhauf) Neusbaum. She graduated from Bluffton High School with the class of 1943 and played the organ at the First United Methodist Church on Sunday evenings through High School. She graduated from the Lutheran School of Nursing in Fort Wayne and started her career of serving others as a Registered Nurse.

On October 6, 1946 in the First United Methodist Church in Bluffton, Betty married Homer E. Petzel. They shared the last 66 of marriage together.

Mrs. Petzel worked as a RN Supervisor at the Caylor-Nickel Clinic for 22 years before moving to Florida.
