Blanche Virginia Kizer, 90, Ossian, died at 5:35 a.m. Friday, April 17, 2009, at River Terrace Estates in Bluffton.

Mrs. Kizer was a homemaker. She was a 1936 graduate of Center Grove High School in Indianapolis. She was a member of the Mt. Orbin Methodist Church and the Tocsin Methodist

Church; she recently attended the Murray Missionary Church.
