Donald Rosie, 96, died Sunday, April 20, 2014. He was born October 21, 1917 to Donald Rosie and Agnes (Gardner) Rosie in Amherst, Ohio. The family moved to Toledo in 1925 where he graduated from Waite High School in 1935 and from Toledo University in 1939 with a Bachelor of Business Administration. He and Eunice Carson of Toledo were married in 1943 she preceded him in death in 1997. Don retired from Franklin Electric in 1985. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church, a member since 1943 of the Paragon Lodge No. 788, F&AM in Toledo. In 1999 he married LeaBeth "Cookie" Raber and she survives along with his children; Donald C. (Deborah) Rosie of Acworth, GA, John F. (Terri) Rosie of Littleton, CO, Lynne (John) Walters of Chesterfield, MO, Dawn Rosie of Converse, IN and Mariah Rosie of Kingman, AZ; and three step-children, Randy (Mary) Raber of Bellevue, WA, Sid (Susie) Raber and Cindy Lieurance of Bluffton. Don was also preceded in death by his sisters, Agnes Myles and Alexandria Perry.
