Doris M. Zoll, 91, Bluffton, died at 12:10 p.m. Saturday, April 18, 2009 at her residence. Born on Nov. 8, 1917 to Edwin and Jessie (Roy) Bowman, she married Virgil L. Zoll on April 12, 1936 in Bluffton. They shared 51 years together before Virgil's death on May 8, 1987. A graduate of Bluffton High School, she was a life-long resident of Wells County and worked at General Electric in Decatur during World War II; Mrs. Zoll retired from Kitco, Inc. after more than 20 years of service.

Survivors include a daughter, Janet (Greg) Thomas of Bluffton; two sons, Tim (Janet) Zoll of Decatur and Kim Zoll of Bluffton; 13 grandchildren; 22 great grandchildren; and six great-great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by two sons, Kenneth and Thomas Zoll; three brothers, Kenneth, Robert and Howard Bowman; a grandson and a grand daughter.
