James L. "Jim" Stroud, 63, of Bluffton, died at 2:25 a.m. Monday, May 28, 2007 at his home after a brief illness.

Born on Aug. 2, 1943 in Wells County to Charles L. and Stella I. (Ward) Stroud, he married Tammy L. Taylor on June 4, 1998 in Tennessee; she survives.

After graduating from Bluffton High School in 1961, he tried out for minor league baseball with the Cleveland Indians as a pitcher. A former employee at Franklin Electric, he was an employee of the Muncie Transit System the past 24 years. He attended Hope Missionary Church.
