Jennifer Kate Bowman, 50, of Mishawaka, passed away on Thursday, March 12, 2026. She was born on September 26, 1975, to Douglas and Barbara Bowman in Bluffton, Indiana.

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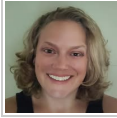

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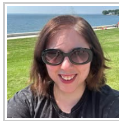
