Joe A. Hiday, 88, rural Geneva, died at 4:26 p.m. Thursday, September 18, 2008 at Adams Memorial Hospital in Decatur.

Born in Noblesville on Jan. 30, 1920, to Harry and Mary (Smith) Hiday, he married Marjorie D. Kirkwood on Feb. 14, 1939 in Noblesville. His wife died April 29, 2006.

A 1938 graduate of Petroleum High School, he was an Army veteran of World War II. He worked at Berne Novelty, Franklin Electric, General Electric and Micro-Precision before retiring in 1985.

Survivors include two daughters, Carol (Stan) Ellenberger of Linn Grove and Connie Jo (Michael) Losse of Madison, Wisc.; a sister, Marilee Blakenbeker of Bluffton; a brother, Malcolm Hiday of Ossian; and six grandchildren and six great grandchildren.
