Lee Coleman, 83 of Bluffton, passed away early Monday morning, October 3, 2022, at Markle Health & Rehab. Center.

Lee was born on February 20, 1939 in Kendallville, Indiana to Carl & Gladys (Good) Coleman. He graduated from Kendallville High School with the class of 1957 and completed a degree from International Business College.
