



## Lucille Josephine Fair

December 31, 1916 - September 18, 2009

Lucille Josephine Fair, 92, Bluffton, died at 9:30 p.m. Friday, Sept. 18, at Heritage Pointe in Warren.

Mrs. Fair was a member of the First United Methodist Church and of the Tri Kappa sorority. She was a homemaker and she worked with her husband, William, at the Bluffton Printery. They owned and operated the business together for 65 years.

She was born Dec. 31, 1916, in Dekalb County, to Bert A. and Georgia May Conrad Milks. She was a 1934 graduate of Garrett High School. She married William G. Fair Aug. 12, 1938, in Garrett; her husband preceded her in death Feb. 18, 2003.

Survivors include two sons, William (Sandy) Fair of Bluffton and Richard (Marty) Fair of Indianapolis; a daughter, Barbara (David) Oswalt of Bluffton; seven grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren; and two sisters, Mary Alford of Tallahassee, Fla., and Margaret "Joann" Spade of Warren.

A sister, Dorothea "Ruth" White, and two grandchildren preceded her in death.
