



Mrs. Margaret E. Redding

February 1, 1920 - January 19, 2013

Margaret E. Redding, 92 of Liberty Center passed away on Saturday morning, January 19, 2013 at Bluffton Regional Medical Center.

Margaret was born on February 1, 1920 in Rock Springs, Wyoming to Rue & Goldie (Feightner) Hunnicutt. She graduated from West Rock Creek High School in Huntington County and graduated in 1939 from the Wayne School of Cosmetology in Fort Wayne. She operated a beauty shop in her home for over 50 years. She was an active member of the Liberty Center United Methodist Church, a member of the United Methodist Women and arranged the flowers for the church for over 40 years. She was also a member of the Homemakers Club of Wells County, where she was selected as Homemaker of the year. She was also awarded Bluffton Business and Professional Women's "Working Women of the Year in 2005.

On October 6, 1940 in Huntington County, she married Dale W. Redding. They shared 44 years together before he preceded her in death on December 4, 1984.

She is survived by children: Dennis L. Redding of Peru, IN, Dian (husband Dick) K. Mynatt of Liberty Center and David (wife Barbara) R. Redding of Fort Wayne, and Debra (husband Phil) S. Case of Springfield, MO. Along with 6 grandchildren, 3 great-grandchildren and 2 step-grandchildren.

Margaret is also survived by her brothers and sisters; Eva Schlisser of Marco Island, Fl., Max (wife Manya) Hunnicutt of Lakeside, Ca., and Lou Ann (husband Clarence) Hewes of Marco Island, Fl.

She is preceded in death by her parents, husband Dale, and siblings; Jack Hunnicutt, Vaughn Hunnicutt, Ruby Bell, Annabelle Elzey.

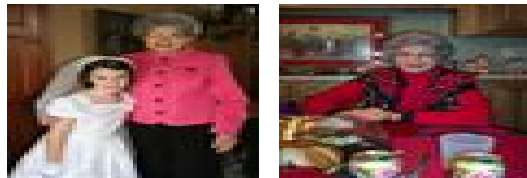
