



Martha (Cline) Colson

March 30, 1921 - December 9, 2008

Martha Cline Colson, 87, of Bluffton died at 4:10 a.m. Tuesday, December 9, 2008 at River Terrace Health Center.

Born in Bluffton on March 30, 1921 to Lloyd M. and Lois Shirey Cline, she married U. Gordon "Bud" Colson on March 13, 1943 at Harvard Chapel in Cambridge, Mass. He preceded her in death in 1986.

Mrs. Colson was a 1939 graduate of Bluffton High School and a 1943 graduate of DePauw University where she was a member of Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority.

A 35-year resident of Paris, Ill., Mrs. Colson served as the Art Director for U.O. Colson Company, co-owner of Paragraphs Gift Shop and was responsible for implementing the first kindergarten into the Paris school system in 1950.

After moving to Bluffton in 1989, she was co-owner of The Kitchen Witch gift shop, member of Monday Bridge Club, the Tri Kappa Associate Chapter and the Bluffton First United Methodist Church. She was a volunteer at the Wells County Alternative School.

Surviving relatives include a daughter, Anne (John) Meo of Menomonee Falls, Wis.; a son-in-law Don (Cheri) Skinner of Bluffton; 7 grandchildren; 17 great-grandchildren; two nieces and a nephew.

Mrs. Colson was preceded in death by her daughter Sue C. Skinner; a brother William L. Cline; and an infant grandson.

Calling will be from 4 to 8 p.m. Thursday at the Thoma/Rich, Chaney & Lemler Funeral Home. Funeral services will be officiated by Rev. Cindy Osgood at 10:30 a.m. Friday at the First United Methodist Church. There will be calling one hour prior to the service at the church. Entombment will take place in the Cline family mausoleum located in Elm Grove Cemetery, Bluffton.
