Mildred "Midge" Eileen Daniels, 84, of Bluffton died at 9:10 p.m. on Wednesday, March 21, 2007, at Meadowvale Health and Rehabilitation Center.

She was born in Wells County on March 20, 1923, a daughter of Rollie Wells and Stella Mae (Foust) Deam. She was a 1941 graduate of Bluffton High School. She earned her L.P.N. through Fort Wayne Community Schools. She worked as an L.P.N. from 1966 for Wells Community Hospital and the Caylor-Nickel Clinic in Bluffton and Cooper Community Care Center in Bluffton before she retired in 1980. During World War II she worked in Fort Wayne for the Navy Department.

She was married in Huntington on April 21, 1948, to O. Blaine Daniels, who preceded her in death on Aug. 20, 2000. She is survived by her daughter Robin (Kelly) Gentis of Bluffton, along with four grandchildren; Mia Angela Gentis, Kit Michael Gentis, Tia Andrea Gentis and Lia Alicia Gentis. She is also survived by her sisters Mary (Robert) Dafforn of Churubusco, Joan (Hansen) Mechling of Kendallville, Martha (Dwight) Siela of Fort Wayne, and Barbara (Manuel) Gurule of North Carolina, and her brothers Roger Deam of Bluffton and Richard Deam of Bluffton. She was preceded in death by two sons Scott Michael and Kevin Blaine Daniels, two sisters Mayme Schrieber and Margaret Schrieber, and a brother Robert Deam.
