



Pete Liddy

February 21, 1922 - August 4, 2008

Meredith Wayne "Pete" Liddy, 86, rural Keystone, died at 12:10 a.m. today, Aug. 4, 2008, at his residence following a two-month illness.

Mr. Liddy was born Feb. 21, 1922, in Wells County, to John Wesley "Bud" Liddy and Grace Marie French Liddy. He married Marcia (Motz) Fuller Liddy on Nov. 14, 1970, in Bluffton; his wife survives.

Mr. Liddy, a lifelong resident of Wells County and a 1940 graduate of Petroleum High School, was a farmer and a heavy equipment operator. He was a member of Local 103, International Union of Operating Engineers, and was also a member of First Baptist Church in Bluffton. He was an Army veteran of World War II, serving in the China-Burma-India Theatre, and was a member of American Legion Post 111. He and his wife have spent their winters in Mission, Texas, for the past 21 years.

Surviving in addition to his wife are a daughter, Becky (Sam) Ringger of Bluffton; two sons, Dave Liddy and Terry (Pam) Liddy, both of Bluffton; a stepdaughter, Beth (Ernie) Heubach of Walkill, N.Y.; three stepsons, Brian Fuller of Ossian, Bruce Fuller of Findlay, Ohio, and Brent (Terri) Fuller of Fort Wayne; 13 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren; a brother, Roger (Carolyn) Liddy of Bluffton; and a sister, Pat Teeter of Chicago, Ill.

He was preceded in death by a son, John Scott Liddy.

Services will be held at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday at the Thoma/Rich, Chaney, and Lemler Funeral Home with Pastor Bud Abrams officiating. Calling will be from noon to 8 p.m. Tuesday and from 9:30 to 10:30 a.m. Wednesday at the

funeral home. Burial will be at the Six Mile Cemetery with graveside rites performed by American Legion Post 111 and the U.S. Army Honor Guard. Preferred memorials are to the Family Hospice of Northeast Indiana.
