Rex K. Gregg, 87 of Bluffton passed away on Saturday evening, July 4, 2020, at Majestic Health Care in New Haven.

Rex was born on October 18, 1932 in Rockcreek Township, Wells County, Indiana to David & Dortha Irene (Penrod) Gregg. He graduated from Liberty Center High School and served in the United States Army from 1954 to 1956 and was honorably discharged with the rank of Specialist 3rd Class.

Rex was a longtime farmer and lived and worked on his family farm since 1968. He was a member of the Bluffton First Church of the Nazarene and was attending the Hillcrest Church of the Nazarene in Warren.

On August 24, 1952 in Keystone, Rex & Joyce E. (Ware) were married. They shared 61 years together before she preceded him in death on June 24, 2013.

Survivors include two sons; Ron Gregg and Tim Gregg, both of Bluffton. He was a loving grandpa to three granddaughters; Jessica Meeks of New Haven and Brittany (Paul) Bingham of Ossian and Abby (Travis) Langholz-Aldava of San Diego, California and 3 great-grandchildren.
