Robert Samuel Myers, 89, of Bluffton, passed away Sunday morning, November 1, 2020, at Christian Care Retirement Community in Bluffton.

Sam was born on October 21, 1931 in Bluffton to Lloyd & Mary Dean (Stech) Myers. He graduated from Bluffton High School with the class of 1949. Mr. Myers served our county in the United States Army from 1952 to 1954, where he was a photographer during the Korean War. Robert worked for many years at Central Soya in Decatur and retired in 1971.

Survivors include his sister, Sara Lee Jay of Indianapolis and a niece, Dr. Elizabeth Jay of Tennessee and a nephew, Arthur Allen Jay of Indianapolis.
