



Stanley J. "Stan" Dilley

January 20, 1947 - November 19, 2011

Stanley J. "Stan" Dilley, 64, of Bluffton, died unexpectedly Saturday at the Bluffton Regional Medical Center. Mr. Dilley worked at Slater Steel in Fort Wayne for 38 years and at Pena's Plumbing and Heating in Ossian for five years. He was a veteran of the U.S. Marine Corps and was a member of American Legion Post 111 in Bluffton. He was an avid Harley Davidson motorcyclist. He was born Jan. 20, 1947, in Fort Wayne, to Clarence Dilley and Anna Shiffi Dilley. He married Cheryl "Cherry" Hill Aug. 1, 1977, in Reno, Nev.; his wife survives. Also surviving are two brothers, Lee (Patty) Dilley of Churubusco and Tony (Patty) Dilley of Whiteland, and four sisters, Roseanna (Scott) Uhl of Avilla, Joellen (Ray) Solga of Alabama, Kathy (Tim) Wenning of Fort Wayne, and Larene (Ron) Pulver of Leo. He was preceded in death by his parents and by a daughter, Erika Smith, in 1995. Calling will be from 2 to 8 p.m. Friday at the Thomas/Rich, Chaney and Lemler Funeral Home. Services will be held at 10 a.m. Saturday at the funeral home with Larry Sprinkle officiating. Burial will be at the Fairview Cemetery in Bluffton. Graveside military honors will be conducted by members of American Legion Post 111 and the U.S. Marine Corps Honor Guard. Preferred memorials are to the Wells County Christmas Bureau.

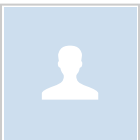

“ On behalf of the men of Combined Action Company Oscar (Stan's combat unit in Vietnam), I wish to offer sincere condolences and sympathy to Stan's widow and family.

Stan was part of a unique group of Marine volunteers who lived in small groups among the Vietnamese people and selflessly sought to protect and train them militarily, and assist them with civic action projects to improve their lives.

While serving at Khe Sanh he was part of the small garrison at the District HQ which stood off a ferocious assault in the Tet Offensive of 1968 by a numerically superior enemy force.

Stan and his handful of comrades not only withstood the attacks, but threw the enemy back with great losses.

The valiant service of Stan and his comrades is recounted in "Valley of Decision" by John Prado & Ray Stubbe, and in "Expendable Warriors" by COL Bruce Clarke. An account is also posted on our unit website:
