August 11, 1941 - December 5, 2008

Ted W. Williams, 67, of Keystone, died at 9:45 a.m. Friday, Dec. 5, 2008, at Swiss Village Retirement Community. Mr. Williams was born in Bluffton on Aug. 11, 1941 to Donald and Francis (Henshaw) Williams. He married Lou Ann Way in Bluffton on May 25, 1963; she survives. A 1959 graduate of Petroleum High School, Mr. Williams served in the National Guard for four years. He was a lifelong farmer and worked for the Wells County Highway Department for 17 years, retiring in 2007. He attended the Petroleum United Methodist Church. Other surviving relatives include two daughters, Julie (Brian) Reusser of Indianapolis and Bonnie (K.C.) Lennon of Keller, Texas; four sisters, Helen (Ray) Cale of Poneto, Nancy Williams of Carmel, Joan (Galen) Gray of Keystone and Becky (Barry) Penrod of Craigville; two brothers, Mike (Traci) Williams of Hartford City and Jeff (Sandy) Williams of Montpelier; and one granddaughter, Lauren Lennon.
