Wallace (Wally) Klausky , Born July 8, 1934 to Miriam (Higgins) and Joseph L. Klausky in Taunton, MA passed away June 5th at Lutheran Hospital.

When he graduated from Taunton High School the family moved to Southwest Harbor, Maine where his father had established a lobster brokering and shipping business. Wally trucked lobsters from Newfoundland and the Maritimes to Boston before and after his enlistment in the U.S. Army. He later owned his own business.

When he left Maine and moved to Florida he was employed by and retired from the Broward County School Board as an instructor at McFatter Voc Tech in Fort Lauderdale. He and his wife spent later years in Venice, Florida and moved to Zanesville, Indiana in 2007.

He is survived by his wife, Grace Bernice (Hancock) of Zanesville, Indiana, his daughter Karen Klausky of Southwest Harbor, his son Robert (wife: Kathleen) of Ellsworth, Maine and his son David of Southwest Harbor, Maine.
